## Bible Readings for this Sunday

Old Testament: Ezekiel 36 v24-28 New Testament: Acts 1 v 6-14 Gospel Reading: John 17 v1-11

## Reflection on today's gospel reading

If we will allow it, this reading can draw us in our minds eye into the time Jesus spent with his disciples at the Last Supper. A precious time together before his arrest later that night. The so called 'Last Supper discourse' occupies chapters 14- 17 of John's gospel. It began you will remember with Jesus washing his disciples feet. There is extended teaching. Then it ends with Jesus' 'high priestly prayer' of which we have the first part here. In it Jesus prays for himself and for his disciples. Imagine being present. Are you, like Peter, close to Jesus, in on the action? Or are you more distant, observing but also holding back? Listen as Jesus prays for himself and then for you. You matter, he cares.

The reading may seem an odd choice for the seventh Sunday after Easter as it takes us back to the day before our Lord's passion. But we recall that last Thursday was Ascension Day and in this prayer Jesus speaks of going to be with the Father (v5,11). The prayer is the longest prayer attributed to Jesus so it is good to take special note of what is said. In the first part, where Jesus prays for himself, words like 'glory' and 'glorify' appear. Jesus' glorification will be accomplished through the death and humiliation he suffered for us. In the second part we can note how the disciples are drawn into that intimate relationship of love and trust that exists between Father and Son. 'All mine are yours, and yours are mine, and I have been glorified in them' (v10).

As we struggle along through our current difficulties we can find comfort in these verses. Like those first disciples we too are invited to come close, to listen, to learn, to know that we are valued and loved. And here there is a special emphasis on prayer. Let's remind ourselves that we don't have to be in church to pray! We cannot currently be close to each other but through prayer and meditation on the scriptures we can come close to God.
