#### The Collect

O God, the protector of all who trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: increase and multiply upon us your mercy; that with you as our ruler and guide we may so pass through things temporal that we lose not our hold on things eternal; grant this, heavenly Father, for our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

## **Bible Readings for this Sunday**

Old Testament: Genesis chapter 24 v34-38,42-49,58-66

New Testament: Romans chapter 7 v15-25a Gospel: Matthew chapter 11 v16-19, 25-30

#### Reflection

Jesus said "To what can I compare this generation? They are like children sitting in the market place and calling out". He uses the example of girls reproaching the boys for being unwilling to play weddings and for the boys complaining that the girls are refusing to play weddings. He describes a situation where people take an opposing view and are unwilling to come together and work together. Jesus found to his cost that whatever he said or did people took the opposing view and John the Baptist also experienced the same. This resulted in John being written off due to his abstention from normal social intercourse and Jesus being written off because he interacted with the "wrong people" – those who were marginalised and rejected and deemed to be sinners. Both were dismissed as irrelevant. I wonder have you ever been dismissed by other because of your behaviour or your views on a certain subject or particular situation? How did you react? How did you feel?

Today we find a world where our views and actions have become increasingly polarized, resulting in a society which is less tolerant, less willing to embrace difference and make compromise. Jesus came to do the exact opposite of this, to bring people together, to show humanity at its best, to bring about healing and show us

what the Kingdom of God really does look and feel like. The wisdom of both John and Jesus were demonstrated through their actions.

During lockdown we have certainly seen people coming together, people have gone out of their way to get to know and to help one another. Tragedy has resulted in a change of attitude and behaviour in all sorts of ways. Jesus challenged the people of his time and we have been challenged in our generation.

This weekend sees the easing of some of the measures of lockdown. For some that will be a sign of things getting back to "normal". But what "normal" do we want?

Do you want your life to go back to exactly as it was before lock down?

Or do you want to embrace some of the changes which you have experienced in lockdown and embed them into a new way of life? If something has had a positive effect on your life and your wellbeing have the courage to sit with it!

We know that our worship will not be the same when we return to church this Sunday, but over lockdown we have all been able to explore new ways of meeting with God and many have found it to be a positive experience. I am sure also that the new challenges of worshipping in a different way over the coming months will also give us opportunities to further explore our relationship with God. Embrace those challenges and do not be frightened to make changes if it results in you deepening your relationship with the one who came to bring us new life. Rev Susan Twynam
