Reflection

As we emerge, slowly and (we hope!) carefully from behind our closed front doors, it seems like we are surrounded on all sides by confusion and uncertainty. There is a mass of detailed regulations and guidance coming at us that we are required to navigate daily, and which seems to change so fast we can't keep up! What are we to do with it all? It is all so unclear, and some of you have shared with me that you are feeling bewildered, exhausted and frustrated.



The gospel reading appointed for this Sunday reflects this idea of uncertainty. Here the farmer can't tell the difference between the good plants and the weeds in his field. All is confusion. Those gardeners amongst us will recognise the dilemma. It is often difficult to tell a flower seedling from a weed seedling, when all you can see is a pair of tiny green leaves. Patient gardeners will know that only time will tell which is good and which is not good as we allow the little plants to grow and to show their true nature.

I am a great fan of the Mapp & Lucia novels, written by EF Benson. In one of them, Daisy Quantock a rather foolish lady who is always following the latest fad, has dismissed her gardener because she thinks she can do a better job herself. She clearly can't! She pulls up the seedlings that the gardener had planted, thinking them to be weeds, and then muddles up his brussels sprout seedlings with those of the phlox flowers and so is uncertain which of them she has planted in her vegetable patch and which in the flower bed under her dining-

room window! EF Benson remarks - "The seedlings in both places were growing now, so she would know the worst or the best before long."

So it is with us in this time of changed realities. We will know the worst or the best before long, but for the moment, we are uncertain what the future will look like and what will emerge that will be of lasting value. As four parish churches within a Team, we will all need time and patience to consider what has been grown in us over these last months. And perhaps sometimes the ecclesiastical equivalent of the mundane brussels sprout will be the thing we need most, even though it grew up where we didn't expect it to! Rev'd Ren
