Reflection

Many years ago on holiday with my husband and friends, we hired a motor boat to explore the coast and beaches of the Greek island of Paxos. On our way home from our days exploration the motor cuts out and we are left drifting in the sea with what appears to be no way of getting back to land. I don't like boats at the best of times so inside I was quietly terrified. I prayed over and over again "please Lord help us", "please Lord save us". It was this that helped me to stay calm, if I had allowed my thoughts to wander any further my panic would have spilt out into the open and that wouldn't have been helpful to anyone else in the boat. After about 40 minutes we were able to attract the attention of a passing boat which very kindly towed us into the harbour. I have never been so relieved and as I stepped onto solid ground I thanked God for sending that boat to rescue us.

In our gospel reading today we are reminded that when the disciples find themselves in trouble, they see Jesus walking towards them. Jesus is showing them through his presence that his help, his salvation is always there, just in front of them, just in front of us. All any of us have to do is look for him and ask for help. Peter as he stepped out of the boat wasn't testing Jesus, he wasn't bargaining with Jesus, he wasn't trying to complicate matters. He was demonstrating his faith and his trust in Jesus.

Our salvation is quite simple, all we have to do is believe in our hearts and ask with our lips. God will always stand before those believe and call upon him to be saved.

Peter only started to sink because he began to focus on the high waves around him and not on Jesus. As we go through tough situations, as we experience chaos, if we focus on this then the despair, the doubt, the panic are likely to overwhelm us also. So let us keep our eyes firmly focused on Jesus, as he walks over troubled waters to reach us allow him to calm us, to calm our storms and to calm our fears and in doing so save us.

A Prayer

Lord Jesus, you are everything and truly are the Son of God.

Without you we are helpless.

You calm the waters of our fears and dry the waters of our tears.

You take the flotsam of our shipwreck and make us into new vessels.

Lord Jesus, thank you. Amen
