Bible Readings for this Sunday

Old Testament: Isaiah 51, 1-6 New Testament: Romans 12, 1-8 Gospel: Matthew 16, 13-20

Reflection

If you read through the gospels you will quickly realise that Jesus has a knack of asking awkward questions. In today's gospel reading, first Jesus asks the disciples 'Who do people say I am?' A simple enough question surely? And the disciples just report what they'd heard said, the word on the street, so to speak! People are saying that Jesus was a bit of a celebrity, like John the Baptist, the next big thing, the talk of the towns! Or maybe one of the prophets has returned.

But then Jesus followed that first question with another. But this time, he makes it personal. 'But what about you... Who do you say I am?'

You can imagine the disciples shuffling about, avoiding eye contact. Oh, dear, it's about me now, about what I believe. I can't avoid the question. What shall I say? Wonderful that here Peter is granted a flash of divine

insight, and he says... v16 You are the Christ, the son of the Living God! It's a really great answer from Simon Peter who was known for 'opening his mouth and putting his foot in it'!

All of us struggle to express just what our faith in Jesus means to us. And I think that's all right, that's OK. The depth of our faith is not measured by the extent that we can explain it, in neat and well-argued theological arguments. I'm not sure that our faith is actually 'measured' by God at all! Faith 'as small as a mustard seed' is sufficient.

And that was Peter's declaration of faith, the best he could come up with. Not what everyone else was saying but what he believed to be true at that moment.

And Jesus responded with approval:

"Blessed are you...." Blessed are you... you will be Peter, the Rock! And moreover, you will have the great privilege and the great responsibility of 'holding the faith' on earth, and in heaven.

So now imagine if Jesus asked us that same question now. "Who do you say I am?"

The best answer I could give Jesus, here and now, is this... "Jesus... There's a power of love in you that has called me to live my life seeking to know you better. It is you, Jesus, who offers a kind of hope, and healing and love to the broken places I find in the world and in myself."

But who Jesus is to ME is not really the question, is it?

The real question is, for each and every one of you.

If Jesus asked you.... "Who do you say I am??" what would your answer be?
