Reflection

One of the biggest culture-shocks since moving to Bexley is how car-centric life seems to be for so many: travel information for events and venues will often give parking details and sat-nav directions first with details about public transport routes as an afterthought (if at all). Assumptions will be made that I will be travelling to a place by a car and 'I took the bus' or 'I walked here' will be met with the sort of reaction I might expect if I claimed to have travelled by fighter-jet or Sinclair C5! There are places in the village where you can stand for a good five minutes waiting to cross the road as car, after car, after car drives past – so many cars! How many of those cars are necessary? How many could be achieved through the frequent local bus services? How many could be achieved on foot or bike?

My lens on this is, naturally, skewed by my own inability to drive: there is no chance I will be tempted to 'just pop in the car' for a short hop, and so I find it hard to empathise with those for whom this is the norm. There must of course, be plenty of other behaviours, actions, and attitudes of which I am guilty and which, in various ways, contribute to the catastrophic sledgehammer damage that humanity continues to inflict on God's World. I suspect too that a great many of them go under my radar to the point where I become ignorant to my culpability and to be called to account for my failures in stewardship would prove an uncomfortable wake-up.

In today's Gospel, Christ discusses those moments when we must call one another out- part of a community of mutual accountability. Being held to account can be challenging and we may often react defensively with denial or excuses when the image held up in the mirror is not the one we thought we were projecting. And it's often the ingrained habits that are the most difficult to take ownership of – we may feel personally

affronted by the prospect that we need to change.

In recent years the call to be mindful of our impact on the environment is one we have heard over and over again and need to continue to hear because things simply aren't getting better at the rate they should be. So much of the call-out is over those ingrained practices, the ways we dispose of our waste, use our household energy or choose to travel which require some personal effort on the part of each one of us if we are to bring about the cultural shift needed to make a difference.

At St John's this Sunday we are observing <u>Climate Sunday</u>. This ecumenical initiative encourages churches to hold climate-themed services on any Sunday from September 6th onward. We will be exploring the Gospel's call to mutual accountability in particular light of our environmental stewardship and care for God's creation. This is a call to be willing to speak out when we observe irresponsible behaviour but also to admit that we must listen for those times when our own behaviour is called out as well and be open to change our ways. It is particularly appropriate that this should also happen in the context of a family service. Climate change impacts all people, but it is the youngest who will have to live with the greatest damage in the years to come. It is often also the youngest members of our community who will be the most aware of the changes that need to be made. They have had less time to develop dangerous habits, and behaviours that must be challenged are less established to them. When they call us out for our faults, we should listen. Rev'd Edward
