The Collect

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in this time of mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Almighty God, as your kingdom dawns, turn us from the darkness of sin to the light of holiness, that we may be ready to meet you in our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Bible readings Isaiah 64, 1-9 1 Corinthians 1, 3-9 Mark 13, 24-37

Reflection

"We are the clay, you are the potter" Isaiah 64 v 8. Many of us are old enough to remember a time when television wasn't 24/7, when there were interludes between programmes, these interludes were filled with short films. As a child I was always fascinated by the one about the potter moulding the piece of clay. The potter would mould it beautifully, only for it then to collapse, before he started again in an effort to get the perfect vase.



This reminds us that we are creatures who are helpless when we are separated from our creator. Our lump of clay is useless by itself, it is only when we allow the potter to reclaim it and reshape it that we can fulfil our

full potential and be useful again. In fact when we offer ourselves to our creator there are endless possibilities for all our lives.

We know that the potter has endless patience and that he will keep remoulding us but that is also wasting time because every time the clay ends up as a messy lump on the turn table means that we are not doing God's work. So we have to help ourselves!

Advent is a time when we can offer ourselves afresh to the Lord. Let us use this time to identify what needs attention and ask God to help us put it right.

Imagine you are a clay vessel which has just collapsed onto the potter's wheel.

Search through the messy lump of clay, take out the things which you know distract you from Gods purpose for you, and cause both you and God pain.

Leave them in a heap – ask God to forgive you for those things.

Now allow God to remould you into a beautiful vessel of your choosing; a vase, a bowl, a cup, a jug, a pot...... Decide how you are going to use that new vessel to ensure that it brings life and joy not only to you but also to those you meet and also to God. Rev. Susan Twynam
